Nestled in the Great Smokey Mountains overlooking Mt. LeConte is this magnificent new home. The homeowners are “empty-nesters,” and both love to cook, as well as to entertain frequently. They told designer Esther Harrison Golightly, of Kitchen Gallery, that they needed efficient work triangles to accommodate the two of them in the kitchen.

The four openings into the room presented one challenge. Another was to incorporate the brick feature without it becoming overwhelming. A soft overall color scheme was developed to complement the various elements and to maximize the spacious, open feeling.

To create an elegant, yet casual look, clear pine wood with no knots was selected. A light glaze was applied over that to give more depth and interest to the furniture-grade cabinetry. The custom-designed door with split flat panels and a cross panel was chosen in beaded inset

styling. Custom-turned legs further accentuated the casual mountain look.

The custom-designed copper hood inset into the brick arch is the focal point of the room. On the other wall is a built-in banquette with a vaulted wood ceiling, providing a cozy eating area.

This warm and comfortable ambiance was achieved by the skillful blending of shapes, textures, colors and architectural details. ♦
